

**HEMCHANDRACHARYA NORTH GUJARAT UNIVERSITY,
PATAN
ORDINANCE RELATING TO MASTER OF PHILOSOPHY
(M. PHIL.) IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION
(ONE-YEAR DEGREE COURSE)**

1. INFORMATION OF THE COURSE:

The name of the course shall be Master of Philosophy (M. Phil) in Physical Education and total number of seats in M. Phil. is 10 and all are payment seats. The duration of the course of instruction for the Degree of Master of Philosophy in Physical Education shall be one year and the examination shall be held at the end of the academic year.

2. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO THE COURSE:

2.1 A candidate shall be eligible to appear in admission test if he/she has passed any one of the following examinations with at least 55% marks for General and 50% marks for SC/ST candidates and Sport-persons who have won medal in the National/Inter-Varsity Competition in the preceding four years.

2.1.1 Master of Physical Education (Two years Degree Course) from University department or any institute recognized by University.

OR

M.A./M.Sc. in Physical Education (Two years duration)

OR

Any other qualification considered as equivalent by any Indian University or Board appointed by the Department of Education of a State or after obtaining Indian/Foreign qualification recognized as equivalent to those mentioned above.

2.1.2 Participation in atleast the Inter-Varsity/National level tournament in a game recognized by the Association of Indian Universities/Indian Olympic Association.

5. PROCEDURE FOR CONDUCTING TEST & AWARD OF MARKS:

- 5.1 Physical Fitness: Bonus Points will be awarded in Physical Fitness on the basis of performance.
- 5.2 Game Proficiency: The marks for Game Proficiency will be provided on production of Participation/ Merit Certificate in Games/Sports which are included in the Teaching Programme of the Institute (Aquatics, Artistic Gymnastics, Badminton, Basketball, Best Physique, Cricket, Football, Gymnastics, Handball, Hockey, Judo, Kabaddi, Kho-Kho, Power-Lifting, Rhythmic Gymnastics, Squash Rackets, Table Tennis, Tennis, Track & Field, Volleyball, Weight-Lifting and Yoga. The criteria for awarding bonus marks is as per University norms.
- 5.3 Knowledge Test (Written): An objective type question paper will be administered on the basis of the courses taught in MPE carrying 100 marks. Duration of written test will be 90 minutes.
- 5.4 Academic Weightage: One mark each shall be provided for every percent mark above 55% marks in the qualifying examination, subject to a maximum of 15 marks.
- 5.5 Research Weightage : Those candidates who have completed Thesis in lieu of a paper in M.P.E. Final will be awarded 10 marks.

6. QUALIFYING MARKS:

To qualify in the Admission Test a candidate must score the following marks or above:

7. MEDICAL TEST:

All provisionally selected candidates shall go through medical test to be conducted by the Medical officer of the Institute or anyone deputed on his/her behalf.

Those who failed in the Medical Test will not be admitted. A candidate may not be rejected on the ground of colour blindness unless it is an acute case.

8. Admission shall be made only from the qualified candidates in Admission Test strictly according to Merit, depending upon the availability of the seats for regular students and students to be admitted on payment basis.

9. ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

- 9.1 Those who fulfill stipulated conditions in clause 2.1 of these rules shall be eligible to take admission test.
- 9.2 A committee consisting of atleast three faculty members shall be constituted to screen applications to ascertain eligibility of candidates. Only eligible candidates shall be allowed to take admission tests. Doubtful cases shall be referred to Vice Chancellor through Head of the Department (Teacher Education) whose decision in this regard shall be final.

- 9.3 An Admission Committee shall be constituted under the Chairmanship of H.O.D. (TE) by the Vice-Chancellor to coordinate and finalize admissions. The final recommendation shall be made by the Committee and place it before the Vice-Chancellor for approval, before declaration.
- 9.4 The H.O.D (Teacher Education) shall be responsible for keeping record under safe custody pertaining to admission for at least one year and thereafter, the records shall be transferred to Record Room.

10. REGISTRATION:

- 10.1 Selected candidates should personally report and register their names (Payment of fees etc.) within 3 days from the declaration of Entrance Test Results. If they fail to do so, their names will be struck off from the list of the selected candidates and they will be replaced by the candidates who are in the waiting list.
- 10.2 If any candidate is employed (whole time, part time of honorary service) he/she shall be allowed to join the course by taking leave from his/her employer, from the date of commencement of Academic Session to the conclusion of the course.
- 10.3 All admitted students are required to submit Transfer Certificate or Migration Certificate within 6 months from the day of their admission to the Institute. Without Migration Certificate no student will be allowed to appear in the Final Examination.

11. DEPOSIT OF FEES:

No Candidate will be allowed to appear in the final Examination if any kind of fee or fees is due against him/her. Roll Number will be issued to a Candidate only when he/she submits the proof for deposit of all kind of fees. In case of failed/supplementary candidates or failure on the part of a candidate to meet the requirement of examination in time, their examination will be conducted separately and for that purpose the candidate will be required to deposit additional fee and other dues if any, as may be fixed by Institute.

12. COURSE CONTENTS:

The course is of one-year duration. The subjects to be taught are given below:

- One of the following specialization areas shall be chosen by the candidates at the time of registration depending upon the administrative feasibility of the Institute.

 - Opt. III AB Physiology of Exercise
 - Opt. III AB Management of Physical Education
 - Opt. III AB Sports Biomechanics

Every Candidate shall be required to submit a dissertation. The problem selected for dissertation shall ordinarily be from the area of specialization.

13.2.1 The proposal of the research problem for the Dissertation should include Introduction, Review of Related Literature, Procedure chapter in brief and Bibliography and be presented at a colloquium. Three typed copies shall be submitted before the prescribed date for the perusal of the Colloquium Committee.

13.2.2 Three copies of completed dissertation shall be submitted by the second week of the March or any date notified by the H.O.D. (TE). If a candidate does not submit dissertation on or before prescribed date his/her result will be withheld and expenditure incurred in rearranging the examination will be borne by the candidate.

- 13.2.3 The dissertation under Part –II shall be examined by a Committee of two experts (one internal and one external) possessing a Ph.D. degree in Physical Education or in the Area of Specialization. The advisor shall be the internal examiner in the committee. There shall be a Viva-voce examination on the Dissertation and this shall also be conducted by the same Committee. Those who fail in Part-II (Dissertation) shall be permitted to resubmit the dissertation with changes suggested and reappear for the Viva-voce examination)
- 13.2.4 If a candidate fails Dissertation but secures pass marks in written papers, the written paper's marks obtained by the candidate shall be carried forward.
- 13.2.5 Such candidates who pass both Part-I and Part-II separately shall be declared eligible for the award of M. Phil. degree in Physical Education, no division will be awarded in M. Phil. examination. No merit list of the M. Phil. examination will be declared.

14. EXAMINATION:

Medium of Examination shall be Gujarati or English. A Candidate who has been admitted as per conditions laid down in clauses 2 to 8 of these rules -

- 14.1 Shall be eligible to appear in M. Phil. in Physical Education Examination, if he/she has completed regular course of study.
- 14.2 "Regular course of Study" means having attended at least 85% lectures in Theory Subjects, provided further that the following types of absence shall be treated as period spent on duty:-
- 14.2.1 Actual course of participation and travel in Inter-Varsity tournaments or any State or National level tournament for which prior approval has been obtained.
- 14.2.2 Any responsibility given by the Institute for officiating, coaching or participating in other programme duly recognized by the Institute.
- 14.2.3 Medical leave, personal leave of any kind shall not be treated as duty leave under any circumstances and will thus be treated as absence for the purpose of ascertaining eligibility to appear in final examination of any part.
- 14.3 A student has to pass examination at the end of Academic year in Part-A (Theory) including Dissertation. The result of examination shall be given separately in mark sheet under separate heads in Theory and Dissertation. Division shall be mentioned on the basis of aggregate marks obtained in Part-A Theory and part-II degree shall have a separate mention regarding Specialization of the student passed in M. Phil.
- 14.4 A candidate must complete the degree of M. Phil. and pass the final examination within a total period of three years from his/her first admission to M. Phil. course.

- 15.** A candidate must submit his/her Dissertation in the second week of March for the final examination and present himself/herself for Viva-voce examination. The candidate will submit three typed copies of Dissertation duly signed by the Supervisor and countersigned by the Head of the Department of Teacher Education of the Institute.
- 16.** If a candidate fails in Theory paper/papers, he/she shall appear as an Ex-student. If a student fails in dissertation but secures pass marks in written papers the candidate will be permitted to complete his requirement for dissertation in subsequent year and on doing so, will be awarded the degree of Master of Philosophy.
- 17.** Those candidates who fail in one or more papers in the M. Phil examination held in April will appear as an Ex-student. A student who fails in sessionals in any of the part shall be declared failed. Sessional Marks shall be submitted at the end of Academic Session.

- 18.1 The Division of passing shall be declared on successful completion of the course in the following manner:-
